

February 24, 2009: Congressman Wittman Statement on President Obama's Address to the Nation

(WASHINGTON, DC) - This evening Congressman Rob Wittman joined members of the House and Senate in a Joint Session of Congress. President Obama addressed the nation on the status of the economy and his plans for addressing the nation's fiscal health.
